Volunteer Update

Thanks to all who helped over the spring and summer in meeting the volunteer task needs required under our grant! Your work is critical to our success and helps keep our out-of-pocket expenses to a manageable level. This is where we stand:

The dye study is complete and the water quality testing continues through the fall. No additional help is needed in these areas.

We need more Clean Boats Clean Waters and Aquatic Invasive Species monitoring help into the later summer and fall months. Any additional hours will assist in meeting the grant requirements, our funding needs and will show our collective commitment to lake improvement. Heard on the Lake...What we have heard from you!

Lake property owners have expressed concern about large wakes causing shoreline erosion. If you operate a watercraft, please remember Wisconsin regulations, which state that it is illegal to operate a vessel within 100 feet of the shoreline, dock, raft, or pier at greater than slow, no wake speed.

A small child was hit really hard in the head with a water balloon during the boat parade festivities. Please folks, be careful, and don't throw balloons at boats that don't want to be fired upon! And, please use biodegradable balloons!

We recently had report of a jet skier purposefully running over a mother duck and her ducklings, thinking it was great sport. We are working hard as a district to protect and preserve our lake and its treasured creatures. Please be respectful, and remind your guests to be respectful of wildlife. When accountability can be established, these kinds of incidents will be reported to the DNR for follow up.

Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Grant Update

The rhodamine dye study has been completed, and although we don't have the final test results, the dye seemed to dissipate slowly throughout the lake. The pre-treatment aquatic plant survey and curly leaf pondweed (clp) bed mapping was completed, and although not part of the grant, a 10 acre test plot for CLP has been treated. (This treatment was paid from lake association Jump Start funds.) Supplies have been purchased for Clean Boats Clean Waters (CBCW) efforts, and boat landing volunteer staffing for the CBCW initiative is ongoing. An AIS educational program featuring Paul Skawinski, UW Stevens Point and statewide coordinator of the Citizen Lake Monitor network was held and we are well underway for the volunteer AIS monitoring initiative.

The Lake District experienced two significant cost overruns in the dye study and DNR permit requirements. We successfully sought a grant amendment to cover the increased costs. As you may recall, this grant is a reimbursement grant, which means expenses are first paid, and then reimbursed at 75% of the approved costs. The first reimbursement request was submitted in July.
