Their family enjoys watersports and fishing on the lake, but their favorite thing about Upper Turtle Lake is watching the sun set as they slowly cruise the waters.



CLP 2024 Treatment Plan

The Lake District and its Lake Consultants have proposed a 2024 CLP Treatment Plan. The map below indicates where the treatment is anticipated to take place on the north side of the lake. Please note that the treatment areas may differ based on the DNR permit approval. This serves as notice, as specified per Chapter NR 107, WI administrative code: that the Lake District intends to treat approximately 20 acres in Upper Turtle Lake with aquatic pesticide to control nuisance exotic aquatic vegetation curly leaf pondweed (CLP). The aquatic pesticide to be used is Aquathol K with the active ingredient endothall. Northern Aquatic Services from Dresser, WI will complete the proposed treatment during the spring of 2024, sometime between ice out and late May, depending on the weather.

They will conduct a public informational meeting on the proposed treatment if five or more lakeshore owners, organizations, special united of government request one.

Any request for a public meeting on this treatment must be made within five days after this notice has been published. The request must specify the topics to be discussed at the meeting, including problems and alternatives and must be sent to Harmony Environmental, 336 Gerland Rd, Rice Lake, WI 54868 and to the WDNR @ 810 W. Everyone's Responsibility: Wake Awareness & Lake Etiquette

Coming out of last summer's annual meeting the Lake District put together a volunteer group of lakeshore owners to discuss the impact of Wake boats on Upper Turtle Lake. We were fortunate to have six lakeshore owners step up and give up their time for this important issue. There were an equal number of owners from both sides of the conversation that not only expressed their view but were equally interested in the other side's view.

After meeting a number of times and through their research, the recommendation from this group was communication and education. They felt that if everyone understood what was happening to the lake and shoreline along with the potential long term impact that can happen with the larger wakes being produced by wake boats, pontoons, speed boats and some big bass boats, we can then utilize and enjoy the lake responsibly.

Large speed boats, pontoons and wake boats produce significantly larger wakes that require a greater distance to dissipate. When these waves do not have time to dissipate they cause damage to shorelines, docks, lifts and other boats. Our lake is considered a fairly shallow lake and these wakes can churn up the lake bottom which then can increase the algae blooms as well as decrease the water clarity and water quality of the lake.

The Lake District is promoting these recommendations from the committee:

- 1) Stay in the middle/larger portions of the lake.
- 2) Stay at least 200 feet from docks, boats or people.
- 3) Slow or no wake speeds in the <u>two narrow portions</u> of the lake.

 "Slow or no wake" means a speed at which a motorized boat moves as slowly as possible while maintaining steerage control.
- 4) Do not make repetitive passes over the same spot.
- 5) Play music at a level that does not disturb or offend others from enjoying the lake.

All of us as lakeshore owners have an investment that we want to continue to enjoy and utilize for a long time. Let's all take this responsibility seriously.

Message from UTLD Chair

Greetings Upper Turtle Lake District Residents. Hoping this newsletter finds everyone well and hopefully enjoying the mild winter and early spring. Hard to believe open water in early March! I want to take this opportunity to update you on our lake consulting as well as our treatment plan for this year.

First, as most should be aware our District and previously our Association has been using LEAPS as our lake consultant. Dave Blumer the president of LEAPS has been very instrumental in providing guidance, development of our Aquatic Plant Management Plan, oversight of treatments and assisting with all the complicated and detailed permitting application process. Dave has decided to discontinue his consulting services and we will miss him and his expertise.

As a result, our District has engaged Harmony Environmental based in Rice Lake to assist us this year. Cheryl Clemens the owner of Harmony is working with us this year on our activities. I won't take up too much of this article on Harmony but you can see the Harmony Portfolio on our website

The main activity for this year is a treatment of roughly 20 acres for Curly Leaf Pondweed in the north section of the lake. We will be doing pre and post treatment surveys to determine the effectiveness of the treatment. The public notification of permit application for this planned treatment is included in this newsletter.


